

Way of the Prophets Jordan & Beit Almaqdes

6 Days / 5 Nights

Day 1: Upon arrival at Queen Alia International Airport, you will be welcomed by our representative and assist you through the customs and immigration procedures, then drive 45 minutes to Amman's Hotel for Overnight.

Day 2: After breakfast you will leave the Hotel to visit King Abdullah Mosque. It is a perfect sample of modern Islamic architecture; it has white marble walls and minarets with huge blue dome. The mosque was built in 1990, it can contain 7 000 prayer. In addition, in front of the mosque 3 000 men can pray, also there is a small Islamic Museum in the mosque.

After, Amman City Tour including a visit to the Citadel, Umayyad Palace, and the Jordan Archeological Museum JAM, after the tour you will visit the cave of the seven sleepers.

Then you will have a visit to Al-Hussein Mosque in the Down town. It was built by king Abdullah 1924 on the spot of an ancient mosque (640 AD); also you will visit King Hussein Mosque (west of Amman). A picturesque site and huge building will win your heart. The mosque looks effective in the evening; there is also a historical museum which contains unique documents relating to the history of Islam. After the visit you will go back to Amman's Hotel for Overnight.







Day 3: Breakfast at the Hotel, then transfer to King Hussein's border. Meet & assist at the other side of the border. Drive to Jericho "the city of palms". Jericho is touted as the world's oldest city and it is believed to be 10,000 years old, then proceed to Jerusalem to view the city from the Mt. of Olives which is Jerusalem's highest peak and it takes its name from the fact that it was once covered with olive trees.

Day 4: After breakfast there will be a walking tour in the Old city of Jerusalem to visit the quarters of the city, then proceed to Al Aqsa Mosque for duhor prayer. Al Aqsa Mosque is the third holiest site in Islam after Mecca and Medina and the most important Mosque in Jerusalem. After, you will have a detailed tour inside Masjid Alaqsa, and then you will have a free time in the city.

Day 5: After breakfast you will visit Maqam of Prophet Musa which is 20km east of Jerusalem, there is a mosque built on the site which was further expanded by Sultan Baybars in 1269, after this you will proceed to Allenby border, our representative will meet you on the Jordanian side of the border.

After you arrive to Jordan, you are going to visit the Jordan Valley which is a low-lying strip that cleaves down the western border of the country. It is part of the Great Rift Valley, which extends down Southwards into East Africa, here you can observe Derar Ben Al-Azvar's (one of the Prophet's friends) and Amer Ben Abi Vakkas (the Prophet's relative) graves. Amer was one of the first Muslims and he knew the Koran by heart.

Then, you will visit Tomb of Prophet Shoayb who is regarded as being the father-in-law of Musa (peace be upon him) and was sent to the people of Madyan, a community of merchants who controlled the great trade routes between Yemen and Syria, and between Iraq and Egypt on the shores of the Red Sea. Finally transfer to Amman's hotel for overnight.

Day 6: Breakfast at the Hotel, transfer to Queen Alia International Airport for departure.

Note: Depending on the flight details, we can arrange a visit to Jerash, Ajlon or Dead Sea beach.
